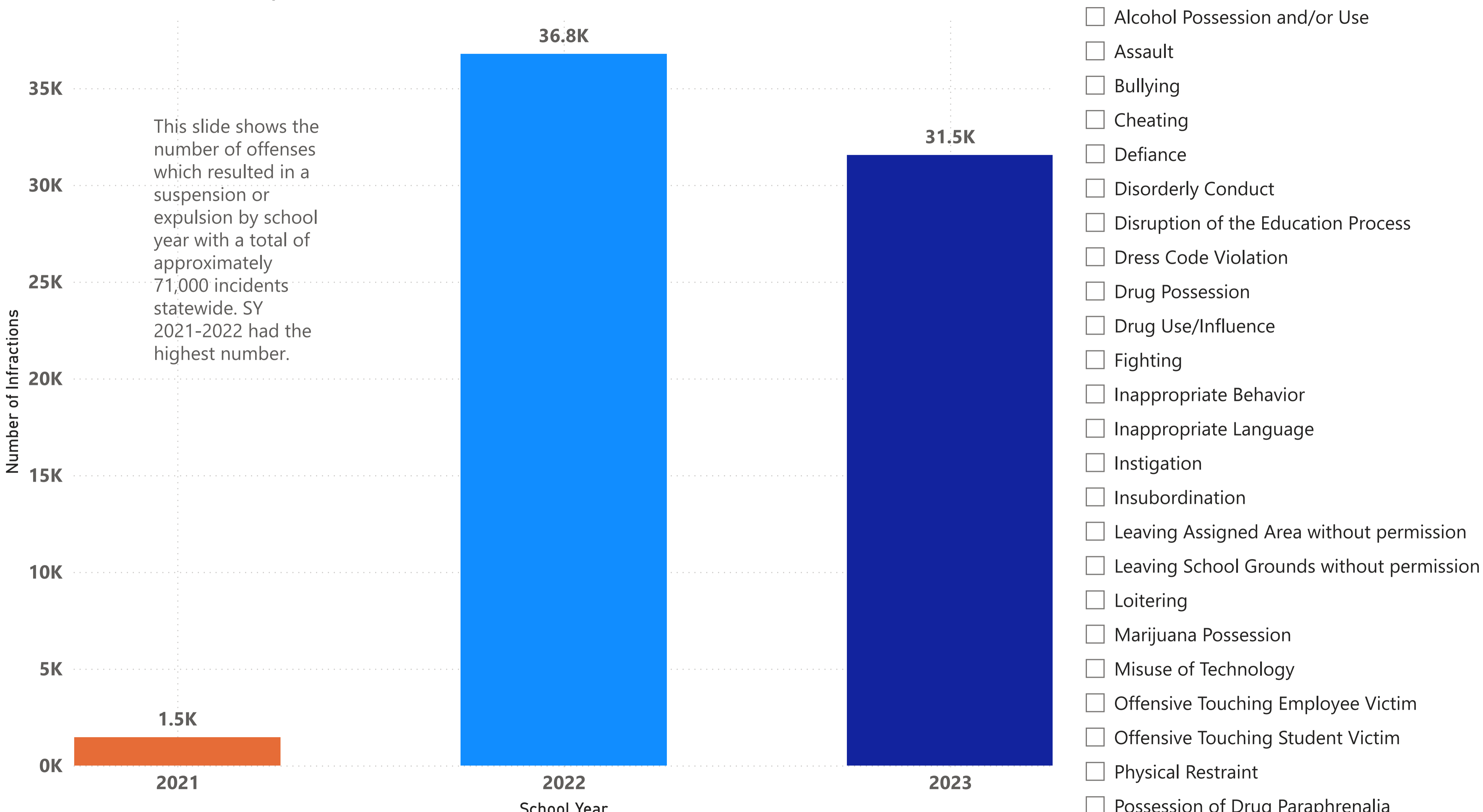
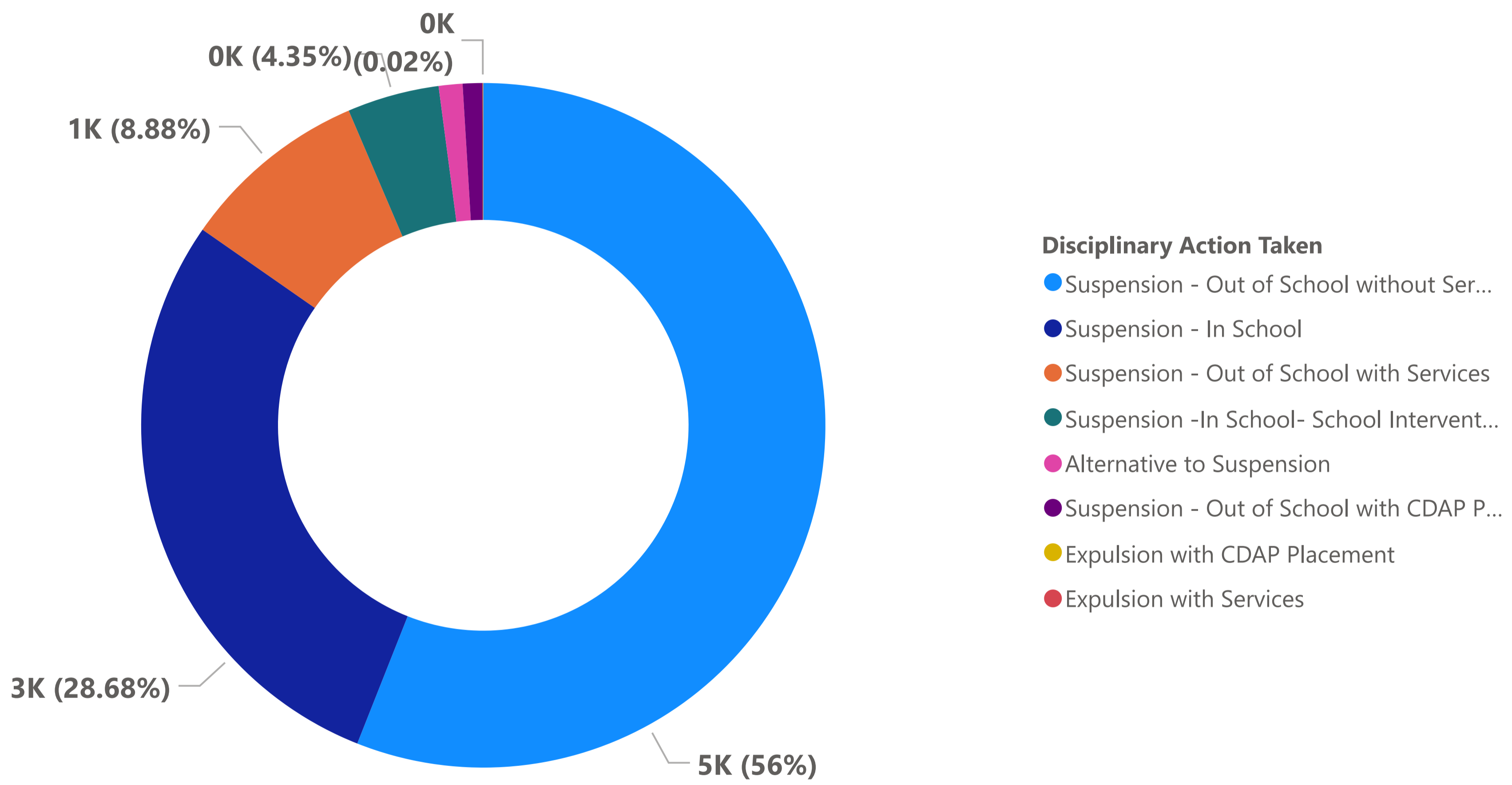


Number of Infractions by School Year



Countywide Breakdown of Infractions with Disciplinary Action Taken, 2021-2023

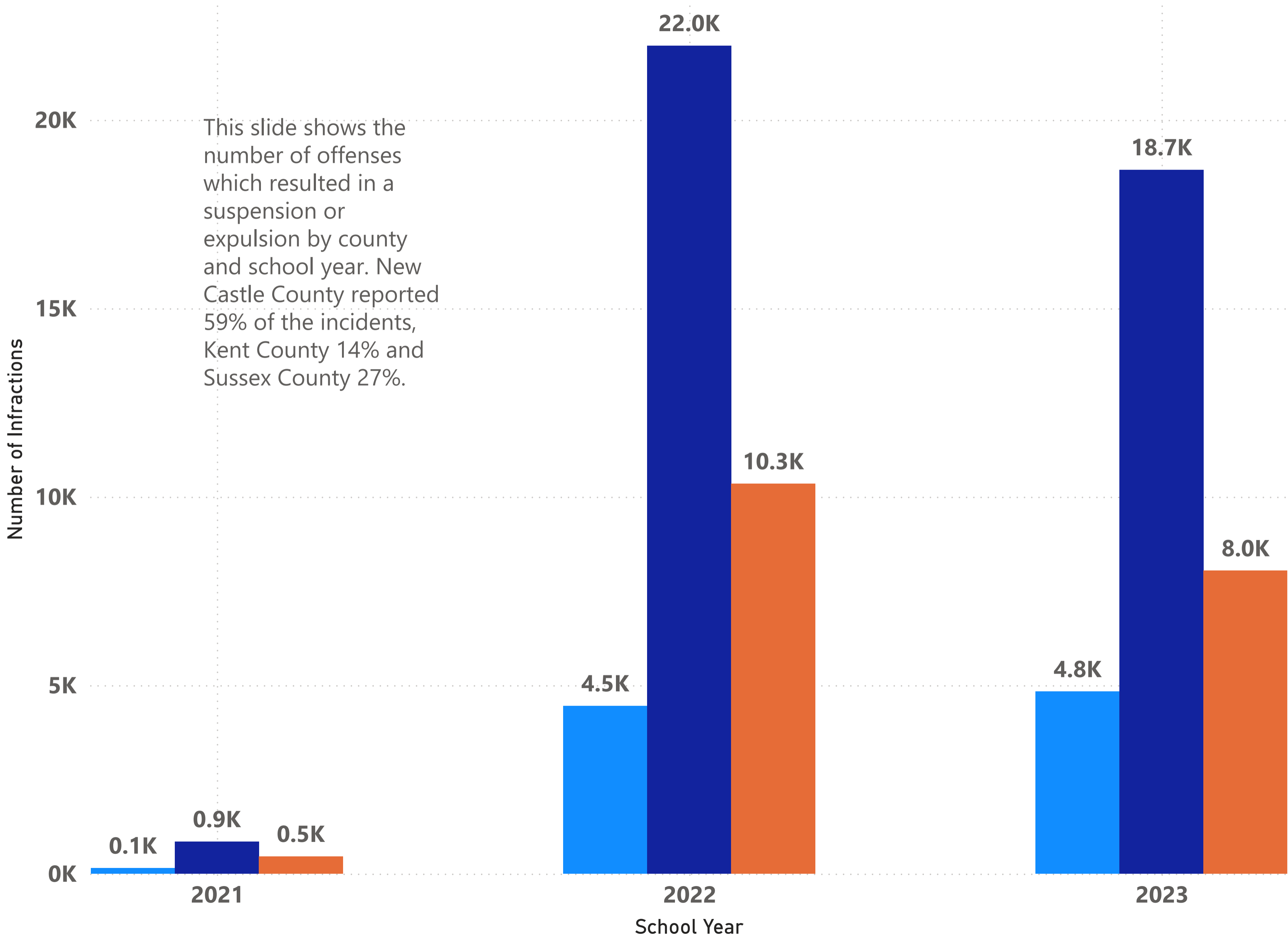

County ● Kent County ● New Castle County ● Sussex County

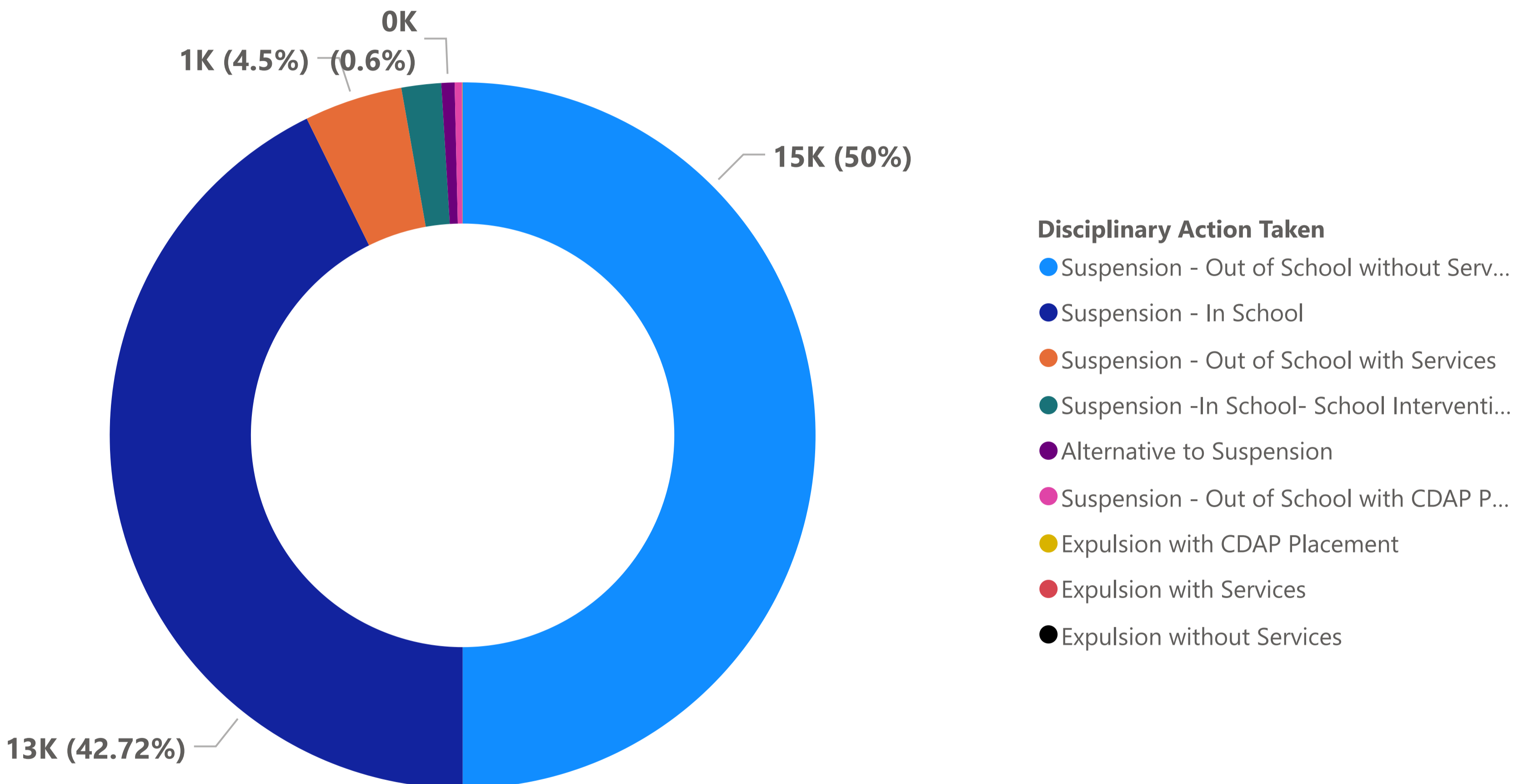

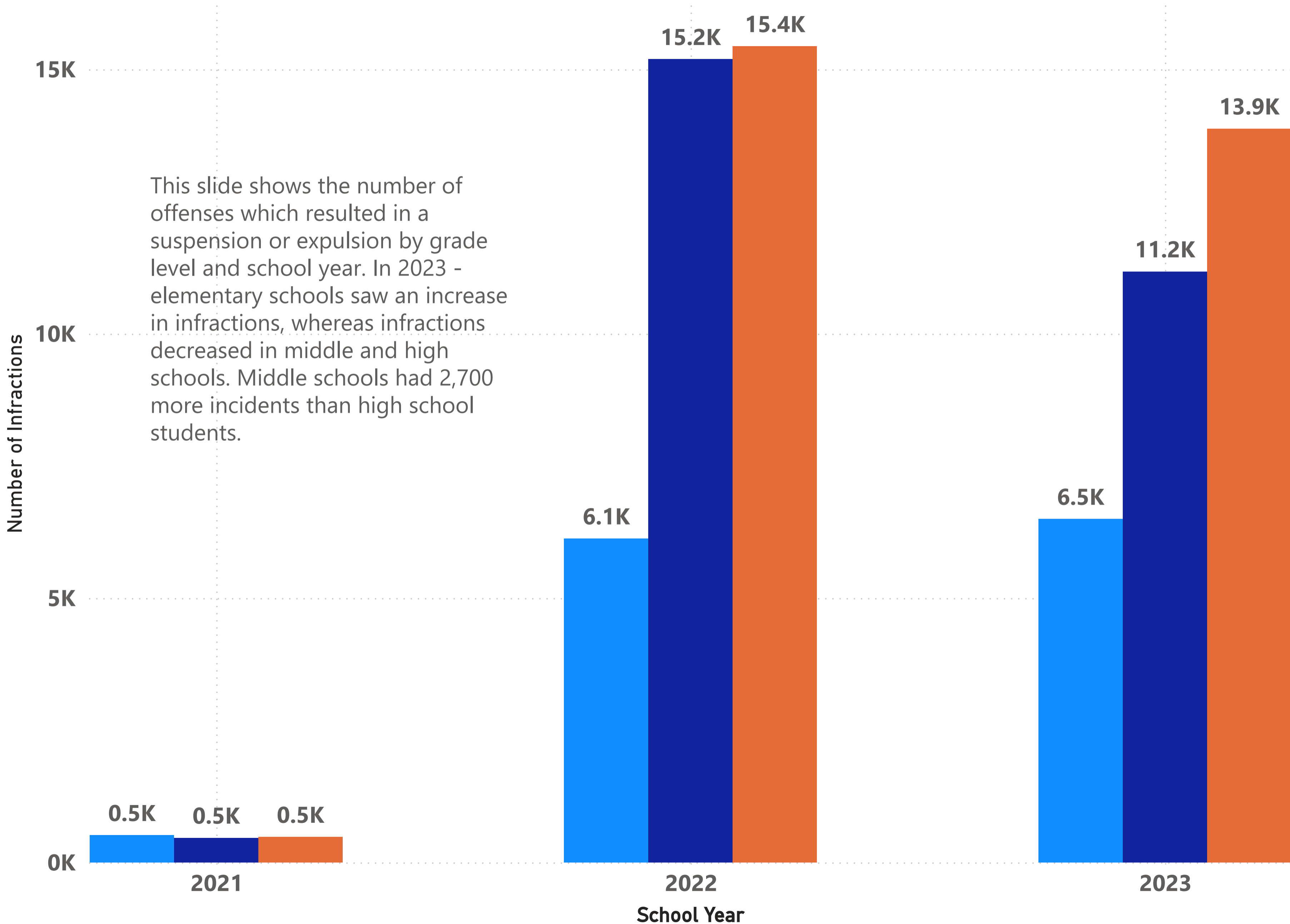

This slide shows the number of offenses for the last 3 years and disciplinary action that was taken by grade level. For elementary students - 57% of the offenses resulted in OSS without services. For middle school students - 50% of the offenses resulted in OSS without services. For high school students - 44% of offenses resulted in an ISS.

This slide shows the number of offenses which resulted in a suspension or expulsion by grade level and school year. In 2023 - elementary schools saw an increase in infractions, whereas infractions decreased in middle and high schools. Middle schools had 2,700 more incidents than high school students.
